Dear City Council,

I have attached 969 petition signatures from community members supporting the replacement of the Merced Senior Community Center and the McCombs Youth Center, in light of the impending sale to the California High-Speed Rail Authority.

We respectfully request the Council's and the City Manager's formal support for the following actions:

1. Commit to dedicating all funds from the acquisition of our property to the development of a new Merced Senior Activities Center, or combining the funds from both properties to create a Multigenerational Center.
2. Immediately engage with stakeholders to assess the evolving needs of seniors and youth, and determine the features that a modern facility should incorporate.
3. Secure a lease-back agreement for the current buildings, or identify an alternative location, to ensure uninterrupted programming.

Given the accelerated timeline for the acquisition of these properties by the High-Speed Rail Authority, there has been an alarming lack of transparency and planning from the City to address any of these community concerns. You do not need an Offer from the High-Speed Rail Authority to begin working with stakeholders and formally commit to replacing these centers.

Thank you for your time and attention. We trust that you will carefully consider the significant impact your decision will have on our seniors and the broader Merced community.

For nearly three decades, the Merced Senior Community Center has been a vital hub, hosting a wide array of activities including mat and chair yoga, line dance, belly dance, ballroom dance, wood carving, crafting, readers theater, a writer's group, dominos, Pinochle, Bridge, Mahjong, Senior Social & Bingo gatherings, AARP meetings, and numerous weekend community events such as weddings and receptions, baby showers and birthday parties, fundraising events and community breakfasts with Santa. Additionally, our center has served essential community functions such as hosting the annual Tax Aide program, Highway Patrol Award Ceremonies, City Employees Annual Recognition lunch, acting as a 2023 flood emergency supply distribution center, and accommodating jury selection overflow for the courts during the pandemic.

The nonprofit organization Merced Senior Citizens Inc. fundraised a significant portion of the current building's construction cost, underscoring the community's commitment and investment in this important resource which led to a unique building use agreement with the city. Given this history of support and the pressing need for a new facility, we strongly believe that dedicating High-Speed Rail funds towards a new Merced Senior Activities Center and a McCombs Youth Center, or a Multigenerational Activities Center, aligns perfectly with our community's objectives and promotes the mental, physical, and social well-being of our residents for generations to come.

We urge our elected officials and city decision-makers to prioritize the needs of our community and act swiftly to mitigate the loss caused by the High-Speed Rail acquisition. Together, let's preserve and enhance the quality of life in our community by reinstating our beloved activities centers.
