



Why is it Important
To Me?

A **Community Plan** serves as a blueprint for future growth and development within a defined area of the City of Merced's growth boundary. It identifies the type, standards, and location of land uses such as homes, shops, industry, parks, and roads.

Community Planning processes are focused on the planning issues or concerns which need to be resolved for that planning area and provide data, information, or policy clarification necessary to carry out the goals of the Merced Vision 2030 General Plan.

Over the next two-years, with input from the community and assistance from professional planning consultants, the City of Merced will craft the **Bellevue Corridor Community Plan**, funded primarily through a grant awarded by California's Strategic Growth Council.

The Plan encompasses an area of 2.4 square miles, and will establish a land-use map, a mobility plan, and tackle questions such as the location and amounts of student housing, research and development parks, and the design of Bellevue Road.

The Plan area is adjacent to and includes established neighborhoods. The Bellevue Corridor Community Plan will address the needs of these neighborhoods and potential adverse impacts resulting from plan implementation.
